What do we mean by Open Access?

Scholarly content online that is free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions. (paraphrased from Peter Suber)

Primarily aimed at *peer-reviewed* research articles which authors give to publishers without *expectation of payment*.

 Open Access provides users with the right to "read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of articles" subject to author attribution.



- Option #1: Make the full-text of your publication freely accessible from the publishers website (Gold route)

Other option to make article OA Hybrid Open Access Journal

- Publish in <u>Hybrid Open Access Journal</u>. Also called OA by the Article, Optional OA, Paid Option for OA, or Author Choice, etc
- This refers to a journal where only some of the articles are Open Access. This status typically requires the payment of a <u>publication fee / processing fee</u> to the publisher
- Processing fees covered by CIHR Grant




Funding for Author fees –YUL Initiatives

Publication Fees for PLoS Journals

To provide open access, PLoS journals use a business model in which our expenses — including those of peer review, of journal production, and of online hosting and archiving — are recovered in part by charging a publication fee to the authors or research sponsors for each article they publish. Authors who are affiliated with one of our Institutional Members are eligible for a discount on this fee.

We offer a complete or partial fee waiver for authors who do not have funds to cover publication fees. Editors and reviewers have no access to author payment information, and hence inability to pay will not influence the decision to publish a paper. Our 2007-2008 prices are as follows:

Option#2 Author Self-archiving

- (Green Route): Grant recipients must archive the final peer-reviewed full-text manuscript upon publication in a digital archive such as the <u>YorkSpace</u> institutional repository OR
- PubMed Central Canada (in process)

Green Route - Open Access & Institutional Repository


- Green open access route Authors deposit their final peer-reviewed manuscripts in YorkSpace upon acceptance for publication
- Simple upload procedures (5 mins)
- Librarians will train graduate students and faculty in uploading documents to the repository

- What is SHERPA RoMEO?
 - A database that includes the copyright and selfarchiving policies of various journal publishers.




How do you Search SHERPA ROMEO?



 The SHERPA RoMEO database can be searched by journal title, publisher names or ISSN.

How to Interpret the Results of a SHERPA RoMEO Search?



- What is a pre-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a preprint is the version of the paper before peer review process.
- What is a post-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a postprint is the version of the paper after peerreview, with revisions having been made.

 differentiate between
 four categories of
 archiving rights. This
 colour coding was
 developed by the SHERPA
 RoMEO project team.

The military section notes the interaction of game applications with new military strategy and technology. A companion paper (O'Neill, 1990b) surveys introductory writings for each game theory subfield that might be relevant to
