American culture in the 1950's was facing a paradigm shift. Consumerism became popular postwar. The Abstract Expressionist movement rose and was coming to an end. The rise of television and sitcoms became prominent with *I Love Lucy* being the largest and longest running sitcom.

The Zoo Story is on one level the exploration of self and how one relates to others. On another it's the sociological exploration of social classes. The play demands we question among many things existence and the nature of connection.
