# If Only...

### **Director's Notes:**

This project started as an exploration of form. First, it was the structure of role-shifting narrative and the way in which memories are really reconstructions of past events, and no two people share the exact same memory, which intrigued me. Memories are constantly being re-envisioned based on events that have taken place since, different emotional states and new perspectives gained over time. Working with a second writer—Jon Boehm—and a cast of four actors—Matt Baggetta, Enza Bambina, Dave Fournier & Justin Kim through improvisation exercises, we explored different narrative structures and recounted past events. From this work, the initial If Only... was written. Before this could be performed however, I re-wrote it in a shorter version for three females and one male instead of the original three male and one female cast, for last year's Fridge Festival. Following that well-received performance, I reverted to the original script and made slight modifications based on the work for the Fridge Festival performance. I enlisted four new actors to take on the roles, each bringing their own personalities and new spin to the material. The show is to the point now, where as much as the script is still recognizable, it has grown and matured and is not the same piece it originally was. Just as the telling of memories change with each new telling, so has this script, and will likely continue to with any new productions and new people working with the material.
