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## WHAT KIDS GET AT RPSM

Regent Park School of Music (RPSM) offers affordable weekly music lessons for youth in Regent Park and Jane & Finch. Students choose from a variety of instruments and learn from highly trained music educators.

### Creative Curriculum

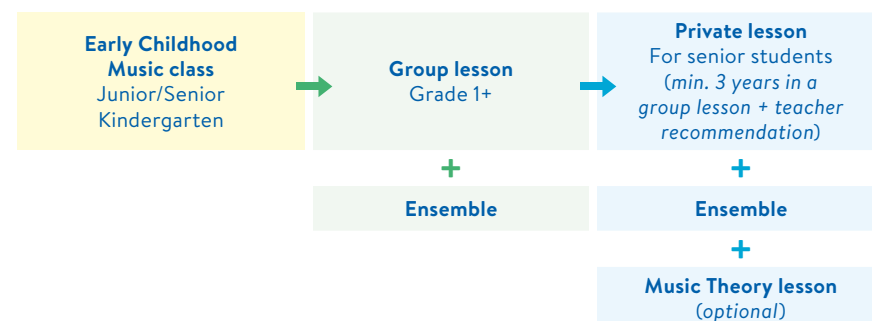
Our unique Creative Curriculum is designed expressly for our students, to help them achieve meaningful social and musical goals throughout their studies. RPSM students explore many genres of music, from classical and jazz to electronic music, and more. We offer students the opportunity to take Royal Conservatory of Music exams free of charge.

### Program Model

We offer **group**, **ensemble** and **private** lessons in a variety of instruments. Please see the descriptions on pages 4–13. Our program options vary by location.

- Students in Junior and Senior Kindergarten join our **early childhood music** class.
- Students in Grade 1+ begin their musical journey in **group lessons** (3–5 students per class).
- After a minimum of 3 years in a group class, students may be considered for **private lessons**. This happens at the discretion of the school and the teacher, in consultation with the student and guardian.
- All group and private students are strongly encouraged to join an **ensemble**, where they learn to play in a larger group, developing important musical and social skills. There are many ensembles to choose from. In some cases, RPSM will require a specific ensemble to complement a student's group or private lesson.
- Private students have the opportunity to take a **music theory** class.
- RPSM offers specialized programs for students with special needs who require additional support.

### Registration & Attendance

RPSM has three school terms:

TERM 1	TERM 2	SUMMER
September to January	February to June	July to August

Registration periods occur prior to the start of these terms in each program, where space allows. We take attendance seriously and require that students commit to their weekly lessons. To remain in the program, students must not miss more than 3 classes in a term.

## REGENT PARK PROGRAMS

Regent Park programs are offered in our main location at **585 Dundas St. E., Suite 220**, on the second floor of the Daniels Spectrum. Programs are open to children and youth living anywhere in Toronto.

Students can choose from several small **group classes** (up to 5 students) and larger **ensembles** (typically 10–30 students). We encourage all students in grades 1–12 to join one group class and one ensemble for a well-rounded musical experience. Students will remain eligible for classes for as long as they remain in high school.

Programs run from **September to June**. We take attendance seriously and require that students commit to their weekly lessons.

### Group Classes

Students begin at RPSM in group classes and may be considered for private lessons after a minimum of three years. In a group class, students learn at their own pace with a small ratio of students to faculty, and with the support of their peers.

## Ensembles

In an ensemble, students learn important musicianship skills like listening and making music as part of a group. RPSM ensembles range in size. Choir is the largest ensemble, with up to 30 students. The majority of ensembles remain at approximately 12 students. We encourage all students taking group or private lessons to also join an ensemble.

## Private Lessons

Students may be considered for private lessons after a minimum of 3 years of group and ensemble study. RPSM offers private lessons in: piano, violin, viola, cello, guitar, voice, flute, saxophone, clarinet, brass, percussion, bass, and harp.

## Music Theory

Students enrolled in private lessons have the option of studying in our group theory classes, based on the recommendation of their teacher. RPSM teaches a progressive music theory curriculum that applies theoretical concepts to performance and composition. Students who are preparing for a Royal Conservatory of Music theory exam can also attend Theory Study Hall for additional exam support.

## Youth Committee
