programme note

there was once a king of thebes, called laius, and his wife, jocasta. an oracle from delphi told them that their son would kill his father and marry his mother. and so, when jocasta gave birth to a son, the child was given to a servant; his instructions were to leave the baby to die on the lonely mountain of cithaeron. the baby's ankles were shackled together, and the servant took him away, many years later, thebes was attacked by a mysterious and malevolent sphinx, who set a riddle which had to be answered before the city could be free again; failure to answer the riddle correctly meant death. king laius left to consult the oracle at delphi, but never returned, and eventually the sphinx was overcome by a stranger from corinth. called oedipus. he was made king by the people and married jocasta. then thebes was strong and great, until another disaster came – the plague. discovering that the plague was a result of heaven's anger, and also that king laius had been murdered, oedipus sets out to answer the second riddle of his career and to solve the second mystery — who murdered king laius? kenneth cavander

This is the third major stage production of the Dramatic Arts Programme at Glendon College. The dramatic arts section of this extra-curricular programme aims to offer students the opportunity for basic experience in all four areas of dramatic art: stage, radio, television and film.
