What do we mean by Open Access?

Scholarly content online that is free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions. (paraphrased from Peter Suber)

Primarily aimed at **research articles** which authors give to publishers without being paid

 Open Access journals are peer-reviewed journals that provide users with the right to "read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of articles".

CIHR Policy on Access to Research Outputs

Policy Summary

Highlights:

- * Ensure that all research papers generated from CIHR funded projects awarded after January 1, 2008 are freely accessible through the Publisher's website or an online repository within "six months of publication";
- * Deposit bioinformatics, atomic, and molecular coordinate data into the appropriate public database (e.g. gene seguences deposited in GenBank) immediately upon publication of research results;
- * Retain original data sets for a minimum of "five years" (or longer if other policies apply);
- * Acknowledge CIHR support by quoting "the funding reference number" in journal publications.

Other option to make article OA

- Publish in Hybrid Open Access Journal. Also called OA by the Article, Optional OA, Paid Option for OA, or Author Choice, etc
- This refers to a journal where only some of the articles are Open Access. This status typically requires the payment of a publication fee / Article Processing Charge (APC) to the publisher
- APC eligible as a CIHR grant expense
- APC Comparison Chart available from <u>BMC</u>







SHERPA ROMEO

- What is a pre-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a preprint is the version of the paper before peer review process.
- What is a post-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a postprint is the version of the paper after peerreview, with revisions having been made.

 RoMEO uses different colour designations to differentiate between four categories of archiving rights. This colour coding was developed by the SHERPA RoMEO project team.

THE SPARC CANADIAN AUTHOR ADDENDUM

Your artide has been accepted for publication in a journal and, like your colleagues, you want it to have the widest possible distribution and impact in the scholarly community. In the past, this required print publication. Today you have other options, like online archiving, but the publication agreement you'll likely encounter will actually prevent broad distribution of your work.

You would never knowingly keep your research from a readership that could benefit from it, but signing a restrictive publication agreement limits your scholarly universe and lessens your impact as an author.

Why? According to the traditional publication agreement, all rights — including copyright — go to the journal. You probably want to include sections of your article in later works. You might want to give copies to your class or distribute it among colleagues. And you likely want to place it on your Web page or in an online repository if you had the choice. These are all ways to give your research wide exposure and fulfill your goals as a scholar, but they are inhibited by the traditional agreement. If you sign on the publisher's dotted line, is there any way to retain these critical rights?

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS AS THE AUTHOR

- The author is the copyright holder.

 As the author of a work you are the copyright holder upless and uptil you transfer the copyright to someone.
- unless and until you transfer the copyright to someone else in a signed agreement.

 Assigning your rights matters.
- Normally, the copyright holder possesses the exclusive rights of reproduction, distribution, public performance, public display, and modification of the original work. An author who has transferred copyright without retaining these rights must ask permission unless the use is one of the statutory exemptions in copyright law.
- The copyright holder controls the work.
 Decisions concerning use of the work, such as
 distribution, access, pricing, updates, and any use
 restrictions belong to the copyright holder. Authors who
 have transferred their copyright without retaining any
 rights may not be able to place the work on course Web
 sites, copy it for students or colleagues, deposit the work
 in a public online archive, or reuse portions in a
 subsequent work. That's why it is important to retain the
 rights you need.
- Transferring copyright doesn't have to be all or nothing.


