What do we mean by Open Access?

Scholarly content online that is free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions.

(paraphrased from Peter Suber)

Primarily aimed at **research articles** which authors give to publishers without being paid

- Open Access journals are **peer-reviewed** journals that provide users with the right to "**read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of articles**".

CIHR Policy on Access to Research Outputs

Policy Summary

Highlights:

- * Ensure that all research papers generated from CIHR funded projects awarded after January 1, 2008 are freely accessible through the Publisher's website or an online repository within "six months of publication";
- * Deposit bioinformatics, atomic, and molecular coordinate data into the appropriate public database (e.g. gene sequences deposited in GenBank) immediately upon publication of research results;
- * Retain original data sets for a minimum of "five years" (or longer if other policies apply);
- * Acknowledge CIHR support by quoting "the funding reference number" in journal publications.

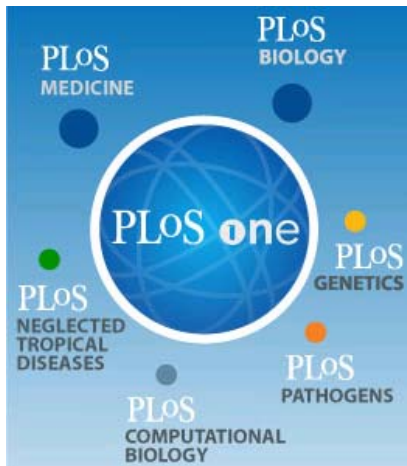

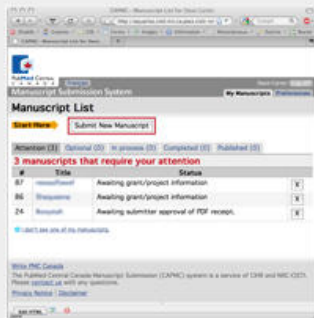

Stay tuned for the launch of PMC Canada's manuscript submission system later this year. PMC Canada will launch its manuscript submission system later this fall, enabling CIHR-funded researchers to deposit articles that are accepted for publication by peer-reviewed journals.

PubMed Central Canada is a free digital archive of full-text, peer-reviewed health and life sciences literature based on [PubMed Central](#), the archive developed by the US [National Library of Medicine](#). The search interface allows anyone to browse, search and download articles.

PMC Canada will launch a manuscript submission system later this year. It will support CIHR's [Policy on Access to Research Outputs](#), which requires CIHR grant recipients to make their peer-reviewed publications freely accessible online within six months of publication.

PMC Canada is a partnership between the National Research Council's [Canada Institute for Scientific and Technical Information](#) (NRC-CISTI), the [Canadian Institutes of Health Research](#) (CIHR), and the US [National Library of Medicine](#) (NLM).

SHERPA ROMEO

- What is a pre-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a pre-print is the version of the paper before peer review process.
- What is a post-print?
 - In the context of the RoMEO database a post-print is the version of the paper after peer-review, with revisions having been made.

SHERPA ROMEO

- RoMEO uses different colour designations to differentiate between four categories of archiving rights. This colour coding was developed by the SHERPA RoMEO project team.

Romeo Colour	Self-Archiving Policy
Green	Can archive pre-print and post-print or publisher's version/PDF
Blue	Can archive post-print or publisher's version/PDF
Yellow	Can archive pre-print
White	Archiving not formally supported

THE SPARC CANADIAN AUTHOR ADDENDUM

Your article has been accepted for publication in a journal and, like your colleagues, you want it to have the widest possible distribution and impact in the scholarly community. In the past, this required print publication. Today you have other options, like online archiving, but the publication agreement you'll likely encounter will actually prevent broad distribution of your work.

You would never knowingly keep your research from a readership that could benefit from it, but signing a restrictive publication agreement limits your scholarly universe and lessens your impact as an author.

Why? According to the traditional publication agreement, all rights — including copyright — go to the journal. You probably want to include sections of your article in later works. You might want to give copies to your class or distribute it among colleagues. And you likely want to place it on your Web page or in an online repository if you had the choice. These are all ways to give your research wide exposure and fulfill your goals as a scholar, but they are inhibited by the traditional agreement. If you sign on the publisher's dotted line, is there any way to retain these critical rights?

Yes. The SPARC Canadian Author Addendum is a legal instrument that modifies the publisher's agreement and allows you to keep key rights to your articles. The Author Addendum is a free resource developed by SPARC and in partnership with Creative Commons <http://creativecommons.org/> and Science Commons <http://sciencecommons.org/>, established non-profit organizations that offer a range of copyright options for many different creative endeavors. KNOW YOUR RIGHTS AS THE AUTHOR

- **The author is the copyright holder.**
As the author of a work you are the copyright holder unless and until you transfer the copyright to someone else in a signed agreement.
- **Assigning your rights matters.**
Normally, the copyright holder possesses the exclusive rights of reproduction, distribution, public performance, public display, and modification of the original work. An author who has transferred copyright without retaining these rights must ask permission unless the use is one of the statutory exemptions in copyright law.
- **The copyright holder controls the work.**
Decisions concerning use of the work, such as distribution, access, pricing, updates, and any use restrictions belong to the copyright holder. Authors who have transferred their copyright without retaining any rights may not be able to place the work on course Web sites, copy it for students or colleagues, deposit the work in a public online archive, or reuse portions in a subsequent work. That's why it is important to retain the rights you need.
- **Transferring copyright doesn't have to be all or nothing.**
The law allows you to transfer copyright while holding back rights for yourself and others. This is the compromise that the SPARC Canadian Author Addendum helps you to achieve.

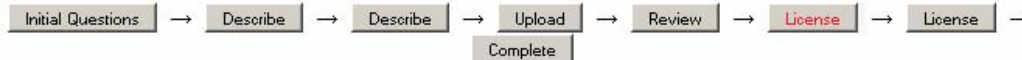

This paper will present a survey of game theoretical applications to peace and war relevant to the continuing debate on the theory's place. (Some contributions are by Deutsch, 1954, 1968; Waltz, 1959; Quandt, 1961; Snyder, 1961; Shubik, 1968; Robinson, 1970; Rosenau, 1971; Junne, 1972; George and Smoke, 1974; Plon, 1976; Martin, 1978; Wagner, 1983; Maoz, 1985; Snidal, 1985a; Hardin, 1986; Larson, 1987; Jervis, 1988a; O'Neill, 1989b; and Rapoport, 1989.) The review will be non evaluative, and will focus on the areas chosen for applications rather than developments in the mathematics. It will be fairly comprehensive in the international relations (IR) section, and include the main subjects in the military operations part. In regard to IR, I examine the mutual influences of the mathematics and the conventional theory or policy questions. The military section notes the interaction of game applications with new military strategy and technology. A companion paper (O'Neill, 1990b) surveys introductory writings for each game theory subfield that might be relevant to IR.
