## Yerma

This production is a class project for the course EN/DRST 2630. It has been a rare opportunity and a rewarding experience to explore the many layers of the play: its poetic language, its mythical world and its exploration of the tension between woman and man.

Federico Garcia Lorca, Spain's greatest modern poet and playwright, was born in 1898 at Fuentevaqueros in the Spanish province of Granada. Lorca came to national prominence in 1927 when his play *Mariana Pineda* was first staged. His first great rural tragedy *Blood Wedding* was first performed in 1933. In 1935 he presented his second tragic poem, *Yerma*. Lorca was assassinated by the Fascists in 1936, during the Spanish Civil War.
