DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We often sort our world into strictly defined boxes: past vs present, tradition vs innovation, male vs female. These stark contrasts frame the way we think.

As a writer, director, and teacher, I want to explore the moments where these boxes start to break down. What do we find at the juxtaposition of these "opposites"? There, where the lines start to blur, we might find that they aren't so different after all.

Centuries after his time, Shakespeare's plays still capture our interest. In the past, he wrote about themes we relate to in the present. As a young queer person in the 21st century, Twelfth Night still speaks to me, providing a deep, personal connection to a man long dead. What does it mean to be a man or a woman? What does it mean to love? In modernizing the script, I changed nothing except to continue a few moments after the ending. Yet, with a new life, this traditional play continues pushing boundaries in the modern day.
