



OPEN LICENCE AUDIO SOURCES

USING FREE MUSIC & SOUND EFFECTS IN YOUR PODCAST

There are **many sources of free music and sound effects** you can use to spice up your podcast. Almost everything you'll find on the sites listed below is available under a licence. That means that **you are free to use the audio if you agree to the conditions set by the artist**. Most often, you need to do these things:

- **Acknowledge the source** of the audio and the artist who created it
- **Agree to use the audio for non-commercial purposes only** (this class assignment is a non-commercial project!)

Not all licences are the same, so be sure to read the terms and do what is asked of you!

HOW TO GIVE CREDIT FOR MUSIC OR SOUND YOU USE

Almost all licences will ask you to **give credit to the original artist**. For a podcast, the best practice is to **include an acknowledgment in your script**. For example, you might add a statement like this: *"The music used in this podcast is by Kara Square, and you can find it online at ccmixter.org. Kara's music is made available under a Creative Commons Attribution licence."*
